Finnish-Style Runner/Cotton Rug Technique Workshop

When: March 15, 16, 17, 2019 (Friday, Saturday, Sunday)

Where: Shiloh Meeting Hall, Springdale AR

Description: Using the alternating 3-shuttle technique, weave a table runner 15"X40" using cotton fabric weft on 15ply finnish seine twine warp. Color, design and craftmanship will be emphasized. Techniques specific to rug weaving will be taught as well as lashing on, cutting fabric in one continuous strip, tension, temple usage, end finishes and more. Handouts include ideas and inspirations, photos and samples, information on fabric calculation, selection and prepartion.

Skill Level: Intermediate, ability to wind a warp, read a draft and warp a loom independently

Cost: \$285 plus materials fee (class fee may decrease, dependent on actual expenses)

Deposit: \$50 due by December 8th, 2018
