Midwest Weavers Conference

Deb Thomas, Cari Kessler, Mary Harp, Ellen Bruce, Debbie Davis, Ann Weymouth and Glenna Renner attended the 2019 Midwest Area Weavers Conference in Grinnell, Iowa from June 24 to June 29. And WOW! did they have fun!!!!

Classes in Warp Rep, Overshot, Color and Texture and Parallel Threading for the pre-conference; wire weaving, basket making, dyeing, Millennial Fibers, and fabric collage classes during the conference. The teachers were great and friendly; they were at every meal sharing a joke, chatting about their passion or anything else that came up.

A few 'mini-classes' were offered on Thursday, registration day; Mary took the class in Celtic Knot Mats and although no one else took a class, all thought it was a good idea that the classes were offered. The classes only lasted an hour, each had a \$2 materials fee and included Dorset Buttons, Kumihimo bracelets, Celtic Knot Mats and Cotton Pot Holders. Several Ladies took a self-guided tour of the Amana Colonies; the history of these villages is very interesting. Although the woolen mill was closed to tours due to renovation and there was plenty of opportunity to contribute to the local economy through shopping.

John Malarkey and Amy Norris, both members of the St. Louis Guild, presented a very amusing keynote address; entries in the fashion show were terrific; and the vendors brought lots of lovely things for everyone to touch and pet and purchase.

Although, the NWAHG exhibit was well received, the awards and ribbons went to other guilds this year. It is noted that there were only 5 guild exhibits.

As of this writing, no guild in the Midwest Area has volunteered to host the 2021 conference. The MWA president did report that there are guilds who have expressed interest in hosting 2023 and 2025. Surveys will be sent out this summer and fall to all members of the MWA, many questions will be directed toward how the members want to handle future conferences.

Attendance at conferences has fallen over the past 10-12 years, mostly because of the internet. You can take classes on line and you can purchase all of your supplies on line, what you can't do is personally interact with people who share your interest. You can't touch and feel the items your friends and future friends have made. You can't share in the joy of finding a new technique or making the perfect handwoven item, or even the disappointment when someone "just had to cut it off the loom".
