It was good to see everyone at the September meeting. Many of you were busy weaving over the summer and so we had a fabulous show and tell. Keep up the good work! I am very pleased that Joanne Hall will be our program presenter for the October meeting. Until recently she and her husband Ed were GlimakraUSA. She is a popular workshop presenter for both floor loom weaving and tapestry weaving. Her program will cover many topics familiar to weavers. They include subjects which weavers frequently ask about and discussions on ways to solve weaving problems. There will be time for you to ask questions. The emphasis will be on: handling yarns, winding and warping, posture and getting comfortable at the loom, types of weaving looms and how it affects ones weaving and evaluating shuttles and other weaving accessories.

We will have the business meeting and show and tell from 10:00 until 11:00; a twenty minute break for refreshments and go directly into the program which will run approximately two hours. If you want to bring a bag lunch to eat during the presentation, please do so. Bear in mind that there will be no table to eat on, only your lap. Also, as a courtesy to your neighbors, think about what you can do to keep the noise to a minimum; perhaps prepping during the break.

The tapestry study group will be postponed until the November 14 meeting. 




A LITTLE PIECE OF GUILD HISTORY—Laura R

From the August newsletter, you know that the guild was officially founded in 1949. The first president was Robert Barnes who also designed our logo. This logo currently adorns our guild shirts and business cards and once upon a time lovely blue stationery.


Here is the original logo.

So where does it come from? It is Draft No. 113, A Blooming Leaf from Arkansas shown on page 191 of The Shuttle-Craft Book of American Hand-Weaving by Mary Meigs Atwater (1937 edition).



When the ACO built their new building where we now meet, Carolyn C wove a beautiful piece in the Arkansas Blooming Leaf pattern. The Guild had it framed, and it was presented to the ACO in the fall of 1993. Until the most recent building renovation, it hung in the lobby but has now been moved to another location in the building.
